PRESIDENT REPORT

2020 was a very challenging year for the Club due to the COVID 19 threat and subsequent complications. A sincere thank you on behalf of the committee to all parents and guardians for supporting our Club throughout this difficult time. I would also like to personally thank all the volunteers, particularly the hard-working committee, for making footy safe and enjoyable for all the players.

The club's main focus this year was on growing and supporting female footy, which will no doubt be a key focus next year and beyond. We hosted a number of other clubs every Friday night to support not only our girls but all the girls across the conference. During the year we worked with the Noranda Sporting Association and the City of Bayswater to obtain a grant to retro fit the change rooms. The change rooms are being refitted to make them more female appropriate, with construction commencing soon. A big thank you to the City of Bayswater for their support ideologically and monetary, ensuring there will be little to no cost to our club.

The success of the girls footy is largely due to the tireless efforts of Jasmine (Senior Girls Coach), Charlie (5/6 Girls Team Manager) and Jason 5/6 Girls coach. It was very pleasing to see the enjoyment and the development of both teams throughout the year, which holds us in good stead for the future. Overall, we had 19% females in the youth teams and 16% in Auskick, which is a fantastic base to build on, well done all! The significant growth in this area was made possible by the generous Sponsorship by Perth Psychology Collective. The sponsorship enables the club to purchase the additional equipment, including playing jumpers. Special thank you to Kirsten and her team at Perth Psychology Collective.

Auskick numbers were very promising considering the circumstances and thanks to Kylie Stingers Auskick Coordinator, and coaches Jason Stingers, Joe Lozzi, Reece Walsh and Jarrod Close for making it fun and educational for the kids. Auskickers played under lights on a Friday night for the first time, which was a great initiative, and from all accounts thoroughly enjoyed by all. Whilst numbers over all are strong, we will be looking to recruit more Auskickers next year as they are our future.

Our year 3's this year were strong in numbers, which enabled us to field two sides. Thanks to the coaches, support crew and particularly the parent group for supporting the teams throughout this process.

Years 4, 5 and 6 all retained the previous coaches, and you could see significant development in the playing groups. All three teams are very close-knit groups and well supported by their parent groups. The year 6 team have been extremely successful in increasing their numbers and will be looking to recruit more for next year to further bolster their numbers.

For the open rules teams, the playing season was reduced to 10 games, culminating in a do or die Grand Final for the teams that made top 2. Two of our teams made Grand Finals, Year 10 and Year 8 boys, with the latter taking out the Grand Final in style at Leederville Oval, well done boys!

Another focus this year was the year 11/12 boy's squad. We managed to build on the squad from last year thanks to the support of another major sponsor, Steve Gough from Prestige Property Perth. Steve's Sponsorship enabled us to realise another milestone for the club in the design and launching of our first Indigenous Jumper. The jumper designed by Kevin Binder is of very special significance, being designed



with the story of the club's foundation incorporated in the artwork. Thanks Kevin and Ally Whitnell for reaching out and locking in Kevin.

One of our main focusses next year is to build a pathway for our players beyond community football. We are a very successful club in developing elite footballers, with approximately 15 of our girls and boys in the East Perth Development System this year, a number playing League football, and our first female AFL player being drafted by WCE recently. We are working with the Noranda Senior Football club to develop a Colts program, to enable our players to remain at Lightning moving forward, with more details on this over the coming weeks.

Membership aside we strategically focussed on two other key areas to grow our income this year. The two main areas were Merchandise and Canteen sales.

Ally, Shae and Joanne have worked hard to source and sell a variety of Merchandise this year. Following the survey we held last year with the members, we have moved towards our more traditional colours in a lot of the merchandise, whilst still providing some modern options, well done team!

Late last year we received a Heathway Grant to assist us in providing healthier options in the canteen. This has led to what can be described as a revolution in the offerings in the canteen, in comparison to other clubs. Well done Joanne for all your hard work in creating the menu. And well done Rob, Joanne, Claire, Pia and Ruby for providing great service to all our members and the visiting teams.

In summary, thank you all for your hard work and commitment to making Noranda JFC a destination club. A club that has a real sense of community and acceptance. Last year in our 40th year, our first action was to host a community event, to thank all those that have supported us over the years. I believe we are rapidly becoming an extension of the community, something we intend to build on, so we are not just another footy club, we are a critical part of our community. Thank you all!
