PRESIDENT REPORT

As the 2024 season comes to a close, I wanted to take a moment to reflect on the year. We experienced a drop in registrations, which impacted our team numbers. However, despite this, we were still able to field 11 teams across both boys' and girls' competitions. Among our 5 Youth teams, the 9/10 girls and 11/12 boys made it to the finals. Unfortunately, the girls narrowly lost to Coolbinia in a close preliminary final, while the 11/12 boys brought home another premiership to the club. For some of these players, it's their 4th premiership in 6 years of youth football—an outstanding achievement.

The future of our club looks bright, with Auskick numbers growing again this year, surpassing 100 for the second consecutive year. Credit goes to Shenae for her fantastic work in driving this success.

Financially, the club is finishing the year in a strong position, increasing revenue and securing our financial stability for the seasons ahead. 





COACH'S **REPORT**



COACH'S **REPORT**


